#### Collect

Almighty God, by the prayer and discipline of Lent may we enter into the mystery of Christ's sufferings, and by following in his Way, come to share in his glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

## First Reading: Ephesians 6: 10-17

<sup>10</sup> Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his power. <sup>11</sup> Put on the whole armour of God, so that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. 12 For our struggle is not against enemies of blood and flesh, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. <sup>13</sup> Therefore take up the whole armour of God, so that you may be able to withstand on that evil day, and having done everything, to stand

firm. 14 Stand therefore, and fasten the belt of truth around your waist, and put on the breastplate of righteousness. 15 As shoes for your feet put on whatever will make you ready to proclaim the gospel of peace. 16 With all of these, take the shield of faith, with which you will be able to quench all the flaming arrows of the evil one. <sup>17</sup> Take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

### Gospel Reading: Mark 15: 33-39

33 When it was noon, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. 34 At three o'clock Jesus cried out with a loud voice, 'Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?' which means, 'My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?' 35 When some of the bystanders heard it, they said, 'Listen, he is calling for Elijah.' 36 And someone ran, filled a sponge with

sour wine, put it on a stick, and gave it to him to drink, saying, 'Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to take him down.' 37 Then Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last. <sup>38</sup> And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. <sup>39</sup> Now when the centurion, who stood facing him, saw that in this way he breathed his last, he said, 'Truly this man was God's Son!'

### **Prayer Pointers**

Hold before God all those who ask the question 'Why am my prayers not being answered?' Pray that they may be surrounded with the love of Christ. May they not give up on prayer and may they find hope in scripture and kind words from those around them. May they see that God is still there in the silence.

Hold before God, our link parish of St Andrew' in Gwero in the Diocese of Central Zimbabwe. Pray that the parish will find the resources to complete building the rectory.

Continue to pray for everyone trying to bring some relief to the suffering after the earthquakes and aftershocks in Turkey and Syria. Hold before God those who are involved in the ongoing rescue and recovery effort, give them the resilience and patience they need to keep going.
